WHAT WE DO

Our **Patient Financial Assistance Program** helps patients access affordable health care through assistance with insurance premiums, medical bills, emergency basic living expenses, and medical ID bracelets.

A **Scholarship Program** is designed to allow those affected by bleeding disorders to attend college, technical school, or individual classes to further their career and obtain a job with adequate health insurance.

Camp Klotty Pine is designed for kids living with a bleeding disorder. At camp they receive the education, training, and life skills necessary to manage their disorder independently. GLHF provides **Camperships** to cover the cost of summer camp.

GLHF Family Camp is provided to prepare families and their child for the summer camp experience by easing their comfort levels and getting a feel for the true camp experience.

The **Wisconsin Bleeding Disorders Conference** brings together individuals and families from across the state for a weekend of education, networking with medical and industry professionals, and an opportunity to connect with other Wisconsin families.

An **Advocacy Program** encourages community members to participate in government by educating policy makers and advocating for a public policy agenda that benefits the bleeding disorders community.
