## 2022 Highlights

- Partnered with the Gunderson Health System to bring 97 members of the Amish community to clinic visits.

### Advocacy

- GLHF's Executive Director testified in front of the Wisconsin State Assembly Committee on Health in favor of Rare Disease Advisory Council bill.
- GLHF was a key player in the Wisconsin All Copays Counts Coalition

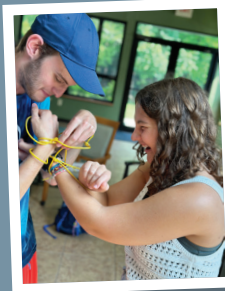
