## 2023 Highlights

- Wisconsin Blood Disorders Conference saw 46 families living with a bleeding disorder return to the Kalahari Resort for education from experts and connections with peers
- GLHF's community advocates educated legislators and testified before the Wisconsin State Assembly Health Committee about harmful insurance practices including PBMs & Copay Accumulator Adjuster Programs
- Approximately 1,700 people attended GLHF's Best Bloody events
- 42 camperships and 11 scholarships given
- Partnered with the Gunderson Health System to bring 100 members of the Amish community to clinic visits.
- Provided emergency assistance to 224 households (rent, utilities, medical bills, medical ID jewelry, insurance)
